

Roles in Outreach and Enrollment

Opportunities to provide health coverage enrollment assistance in Colorado



This fact-sheet is intended to help outreach and enrollment (O&E) professionals understand different capacities in which they can help their community members enroll in health coverage affordability programs. HEALTH COVERAGE GUIDES

Colorado's health insurance marketplace, [Connect for Health Colorado](#), has an established Assistance Network of Health Coverage Guides (HCGs) who provide impartial information and assist Coloradans with applying for and enrolling in qualified health plans through the marketplace. The Assistance Network funds and certifies Assistance Sites to supervise HCGs who provide outreach, education, and direct enrollment assistance to customers and small businesses.

CERTIFIED APPLICATION COUNSELORS

The Certified Application Counselor (CAC) program offered by Connect for Health Colorado is an unfunded opportunity for organizations to become certified to provide marketplace enrollment assistance. The CAC opportunity is ideal for organizations already engaged in O&E in other health insurance affordability programs. Organizations must apply to become CAC designated site and ensure that staff are trained and certified to provide marketplace enrollment assistance on annual basis.

STATE CONTRACTED APPLICATION ASSISTANCE SITES

Medical Assistance (MA), Presumptive Eligibility (PE), and Certified Application Assistance Sites (CAAS), are certified by the Colorado Department of Health Care and Financing (HCPF) to provide different levels of Medicaid and Child Health Plan *Plus* (CHP+) application and enrollment assistance. All sites provide application assistance and identification and citizenship document verification. PE sites can also determine temporary program eligibility for pregnant women and children. MA sites can process Medicaid and CHP+ applications, and determine eligibility for all applicants.

BROKERS and AGENTS

Insurance brokers and agents are licensed individuals who sell private insurance plans and earn commission from insurance carriers. Brokers must complete training and be certified by Connect for Health Colorado if they would like to sell marketplace qualified health plans.

MARKETPLACE OUTREACH and EDUCATION

Organizations that do not wish to provide direct application and enrollment assistance can provide outreach and education about Connect for Health Colorado instead.
