<p>DOP Member Updates</p>	<p>Denver Health’s new electronic health record system went live. Because providers are learning the new system, appointment availability is at 50 percent. Over the next several weeks it will increase back to 100 percent. Information may not have completely transferred to the new system so patients should bring their ID to appointments. The new system will allow for reporting to target outreach. Patients are able to sign up for to see their medical record (my chart) online.</p> <p>Q. Can my charts be set up on an individual level or are they tied to families? A. A parent can see their children. Delta Dental is in the process of revising materials based on feedback from the Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing’s (HCPF) Person- and Family-Centered Advisory Council. New flyers will be available that the next DOP meeting.</p> <p>Adams-12 Five Star School District is currently providing 25 percent Medicaid/CHP+ enrollment and 75 percent resource support to families. They are currently updating flyers to alert families about Medicaid and CHP+. They are also planning for school registration events in the fall. They have seen an increase in referrals and have served 1,300 families this year.</p>

FPLs are used to determine eligibility for certain programs and benefits, including</p>	

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	<p>Medicaid and CHP+. In accordance with federal law, HCPF updated the FPLs for all Medical Assistance programs. The new income levels are effective April 1, 2016. Updated income charts are now available for Modified Adjusted Gross Income Medicaid and CHP+.</p> <p>New Resources on Annualized Income In March, HCPF held a webinar for stakeholders on implementing annualized income for certain clients with self-employment income, commission-based income, and/or seasonal-based income. For more information, contact Geoffrey Oliver.</p> <p>Person-and Family-Centered Approach: Creating a Culture of Collaboration with Members HCPF hosted a town hall-style meeting and webinar in February to share successes and challenges of person-centeredness efforts and to get stakeholder feedback on the next phase of this work. In early March, HCPF was awarded a renewal grant from the Colorado Health Foundation for Phase II, which will be used to fully implement the Strategic Plan and begin to extend person-centered principles to selected vendors, contractors, and providers and incorporate person-centeredness into vendor contract language. Lisa will ask the data unit. Week to week and month to month kids are shown as unenrolled when they did pay their enrollment fee or they move.</p> <p>Q. Are kids losing their benefits during that time? A. Sometimes. During these situations, HCPF works with the counties to help reenroll them.</p>
